
Before School Care

It will be available from 7.30 to 8.30 am. <u>No child is to arrive to school before 7.30 am.</u> Any child who arrives before 8.30am must sign in at the hall. If you know your child arrives around 8.15am they still need to sign in. There will be a Weet-Bix breakfast provided for your child if they would like to have one if they arrive <u>BEFORE</u> 8:10am.

- Cost: \$2 per day for before 8.15 am.
- •Families with more than one child \$3 per day, per family.
- •The cost for arriving from 8:15am-8:30am will be \$20 for the term. (Perfamily)




FEEDBACK SURVEY

Temporary Suspension of all Masses due to Covid 19

The New Zealand Catholic Bishops have been carefully considering the steps they need to take with Mass and other public liturgical gatherings because of the strong Government restrictions on public gatherings to counter the Covid-19 coronavirus pandemic.

Effective immediately, all Masses are to cease until further notice.

Churches may remain open seven days a week for private prayers and reflection, but parish priests should ensure that numbers of people present remain small and follow Ministry of Health social distancing guidelines to stay at least 2 metres from each other.
